

Alto “Bud” Adams Jr. & Payne Midyette, Memorial Scholarship Application



The United Braford Breeders (UBB) and National Junior Braford Association (NJBA) is proud to offer the Alto “Bud” Adams, Jr. & Payne Midyette Memorial Scholarship.

Mr. Adams was a founding member of the United Braford Breeders Association and was responsible for the development of the Braford breed. He was also a devoted family man, innovative cattleman, cowboy, outdoorsman, and conservationist. More importantly, Mr. Adams was a trustworthy and honorable man motivated by his Christian faith.

Payne Midyette, close friend to Bud could be found doing some of the same things. He was passionate about the cattle industry, enjoyed spending time on his horses, working side by side with his family, and was fond of the outdoors, hunting or fishing. Payne was a model family man and heavily involved within his community.

Mr. Adams & Mr. Midyette both made a tremendous impact on the Braford breed and on all of those who were privileged to know them. To honor their lives and legacy, the UBB/NJBA is offering a memorial scholarship. The winner will be announced at the NJBA All-American.

Procedures:

Applications should be returned to UBB, no later than June 15, 2023.

A subjective scholarship review and selection committee, comprised of current UBB Board of Directors, will review each application and select the scholarship recipient based on the following:

- Academic performance
- Participation & leadership in clubs, activities & organizations (agricultural on-agricultural specific)
- Previous awards, honors and recognitions
- Future goals & ambitions
- Participation in & contributions to the NJBA & UBB
- Financial needs will be considered, but only as a part of the criteria, it will not be an absolute consideration.

To be eligible for the Alto “Bud” Adams, Jr. & Payne Midyette Memorial Scholarship, candidates must be:

1. Active NJBA members
2. In good standing with the UBB
3. Have cattle (as an individual or as part of immediate family operation) registered with UBB
4. Be or have been an active participant in past NJBA All American events
5. High School senior (Class of 2023) or currently enrolled in trade school, community college, university, or other institution of higher learning

6. Have a current college or high school GPA of 2.5 or higher, or proof of successful progress through trade school program
7. Present for the in person interview at the All-American
8. Instructions:

All scholarship applications should be typed. Additional pages may be added to the scholarship form if needed and should directly follow the page on which the question appears. Please email your application & the required material by June 15, 2023.

- An official college, high school, or trade school transcript must accompany the scholarship application.
- Your application must include three letters of recommendation.
- The letters should include your association with the individual writing the letter of recommendation along with a candid evaluation of your abilities, accomplishments, and character supported by examples.
- The recommendation may come from teachers, coaches, employers or clergy. They may not include parents, UBB employees, or UBB Board of Directors.
- The letters of recommendation must be submitted with the scholarship application by appointed deadline.
- Applications and supporting material must be postmarked on or before June 15, 2023.

The Alto "Bud" Adams, Jr. & Payne Midyette Memorial Scholarship will be announced at the NJBA All American.

For an application to be eligible for review, it must include:

- Completed & signed application
- Three letters of recommendations
- An official high school, trade school, or college transcript
- Available for interview
- Postmarked or emailed by June 15, 2023.
